

Numbers 21:4-9

From Mount Hor the Israelites set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Ephesians 2:1-10

You were dead through the trespasses and sins in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ-- by grace you have been saved — and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God — not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.


People We lift them to the Lord.

The Celebrant continues

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God. Living among us, Jesus loved us. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. He yearned to draw all the world to himself yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love. Then, the time came for him to complete upon the cross the sacrifice of his life, and to be glorified by you.

On the night before he died for us, Jesus was at table with his friends. He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to them, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine. Again, he gave thanks to you, gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Now gathered at your table, O God of all creation, and remembering Christ, crucified and risen, who was and is and is to come, we offer to you our gifts of bread and wine, and ourselves, a living sacrifice.

Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new creation, the Body of Christ given for the world you have made.

In the fullness of time bring us, with St. John and all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.



Reflection

This Sunday, we'll hear "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son...." According to some sources, it is the most frequently quoted passage of Scripture, the "memory verse par excellence," according to one commentator.

But John 3:16 is part of a larger narrative in which Nicodemus comes to Jesus by dark of night, seeking enlightenment about who Jesus is, and exactly what he's up to. Jesus speaks of being born again, born from above; being of the spirit; being the light which the darkness shall not overcome. In short, the famous passage tells us, the "why" of Jesus's very life (and death, and resurrection) is God's love.

Further, the John reading opens with a reference to a little-known passage from the Book of Numbers in which Moses made a bronze serpent to save the people, after a plague of real serpents killed many who complained against God and Moses. Are we to equate the lifting of the serpent on a pole and the lifting of Jesus on the cross? God's love, again? It is tricky terrain.

This week, you are invited to further explore our Sunday readings as well as these questions:

- 1. The past year has held much darkness. Yet many people have found light and hope in unexpected ways. What does it mean to you to be a person of the light?
- 2. It is said that we often need to face our fears directly in order to heal (e.g., the Israelites gazing upon the image of a serpent to be saved). Have you ever experienced this? How?
- 3. Try changing the tense of John 3:16 to the present: "For God so LOVES the world..."; how does that perspective change how you receive it?


